READING THE BIBLE IN ONE YEAR

GOAL: Since 2005 we have been reading through the whole Bible each year by reading three to four chapters per day. Previously we have read in three different places beginning at Genesis 1, Psalm 1 and Matthew 1. The goal remains the same: to read the whole Bible in a year.

In 2009 we are recommending again that each of us plans to read the whole Bible through in one year. Many of us have benefited much by keeping to the discipline of set readings. However we are recommending that we read one book at a time and many have affirmed this change as being helpful. Reading one book at a time will enhance our understanding of the book and enable specific study of the book.

The only books that are divided up are Psalms and Proverbs. These are interspersed through the readings.

PURPOSE: To return to the word of God; to be disciples of the word; to be diligent in 'adding knowledge to our faith' (2 Pet.1:5); to grow in our discipleship, knowing the word of God for ourselves; 'to search the Scriptures' with the help of the Holy Spirit, that we may be 'complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work' (2Tim3:17).

God speaks to us through His word and His word alone is the measure and the judge of all things. We desire to move away from mis-interpretation and traditional practice to find out what the word of God says. In the beginning was the word, not an interpretation. God and His word are synonymous, and the Word was God (Jn.1:1).
